



## 2020 Two Shilling Red

This wine shows loads of upfront jammy fruit. The strawberry, raspberry and cherry notes blend smoothly into a smoky earthiness which creates a nice complexity. The wine is clean and well balanced for a jammy style. The fruit lingers a long time on the palate and finishes with loads of fresh fruit. There is a brightness to the wine that compliments the weight nicely. A great wine for the picnic basket or barbeque. – *Matthew Meyer, Winemaker*

**THE STORY BEHIND THE NAME:**

In 1621, when “ancient planter” John Johnson recorded his 100 acres located on Archer’s Hope, the 300-acre farm where the Winery now stands, his “fee rent” to the Crown was two shillings. The name John Johnson is found on the document identifying the first settlers including Captain John Smith. A copy of the original document is on exhibit in the Museum at the winery.
